MMR vaccine protects against measles, mumps and rubella (German measles). **Before starting** higher education students should have had two doses. **(Recommended, not essential)**

TB TEST

Indian nationals are **required to take a Tuberculosis test from APPROVED test clinics**. More information:



HEATHROW AIRPORT TO UNIVERSITY OF WARWICK

1. Flights:

Options: You can book a direct flight or a flight with a layover to London Heathrow.

2. Getting from London Heathrow Airport:

By Cab:

- You can call for an Uber, Akmal Cabs (Phone: +44 7973 868889), or Ghalib (Phone: +44 7867099857).
- It's recommended to travel with someone if it's your first time.
- Cost: Usually above £125.

By Bus:

- Take a bus from Heathrow Airport to Coventry Pool Meadow Bus Station.
- The bus departs from a specific terminal; you can use the free underground service within Heathrow to reach the bus terminal.

By Train:

- Take the Elizabeth Line from Heathrow Airport to London Liverpool Street.
- From there, take a train to Coventry Station.

BIRMINGHAM AIRPORT TO UNIVERSITY OF WARWICK

1. Flights:

Options: You can book a direct flight or a flight with a layover to Birmingham Airport.

2. Getting from Birmingham Airport:

By Cab:

- You can call for an Uber, Akmal Cabs (Phone: +44 7973 868889), or Ghalib (Phone: +44 7867099857).
- It's recommended to travel with someone if it's your first time.
- Cost: Usually above £25.

By Bus:

- Take a bus from Birmingham Airport to Coventry Pool Meadow Bus Station.
- Then take another bus from Coventry Pool Meadow Station to University of Warwick.

By Train:

- Take the Cross Country from Birmingham International to Leamington Spa or Coventry Station.
- Further take a bus or a cab from the station to the University of Warwick.

STUDENT E-VISA (UKVI ACCOUNT)

The UK stopped issuing new biometric residence permits (BRPs) on 31 October 2024. Make sure your UKVI account login is secure and accessible, as that's where you can view and prove your immigration status. When asked for your visa proof, use the UK government's 'View and Prove your Immigration Status' online service. It's quick and widely accepted. More information:

SIM CARD

You may buy sim cards from Coventry city centre or any of the supermarkets in and around university (TESCO, CannonPark, Rootes). Sim cards are normally free as you pay when you buy an internet pack. You may also have been provided with a Sim card along with your visa.

If you are new to the University and living on campus you should register with a GP practice at the University Health Centre as soon as possible. - Make sure to carry a FOREX card to suffice you until you open a bank account.
- E-Banking platforms such as Revolut and Monzo are also very popular due to their convenience. But make sure you have an account in a bank listed above before opening an account in one of these.

Payment Instructions

You may pay your fees through the Warwick eVision portal which is linked in your CAS confirmation email (hyperlinked to 'Enrolment Dashboard'). Please proceed to the 'My Student Finance' section on the eVision portal to pay your tuition and accommodation fees.

COMMON WAYS OF PAYING FEES ARE:

- Bank transfer via FlyWire (directions provided on the eVision portal : <https://warwick.ac.uk/evision/>)
- Credit/Debit Card via FlyWire (note that these are typically more expensive than bank transfers due to which most students do not prefer this method of payment)
- Direct Debit setup



Budgeting Tips

TRAVELLING AROUND CAMPUS

- Cycling and walking are popular ways to get around campus. Paid rental bikes are available for convenience, and you can buy affordable second-hand bikes during the freshers' sale.
- Book an Uber/Bolt to travel off campus late at night. Black cabs are also available if needed.
- Late-night buses are available until a certain time and can be a cost-effective commuting option once you adjust to university life.
- Use the buses at University Interchange to travel to nearby towns like Coventry and Leamington Spa, with departures every 15-30 minutes. (U1 and U2 buses go to Leamington Spa, while the 12X is the main bus to Coventry.)
- Walking late at night? Explore campus safely with these tips:
 1. *Safety checkpoints are located around campus.*
 2. *Campus security, managed by Warwick Community Safety, is available 24/7.*
 3. *Contact them at 024 7652 2083 (ext. 22222).*
- The campus map can be accessed via the 'MyWarwick' app, a handy tool for when you are getting late for lectures or lost on campus.




INTRA-UK TRAVEL GUIDE
